The human individual is set at the detailed end of a spacetime scale range: today's pervasive positioning empowers operational geoinformatics across scales.

Spatial Sciences today contribute to a more just, ethical and sustainable society. **Prominent keynote speakers** will highlight new developments, offer visionary insights into trends and developments, and at the same time be individually accessible for our **Young Researchers**.
